FAQ

Who is this for?

This resource was created for Campus Staff Ministers (CSMs) to quickly see the basics of good NSO. The hope is that CSMs will discuss their plan with their Area Director and review this scorecard together. Larger chapters with an exec team could do this activity together.

When should I fill this out? At what point in my year?

It depends on your context. We recommend using the scorecard when first thinking through the fall (usually mid to late spring) and again at the end of NSO as part of debriefing.

How do I fill it out?

Read each prompt and select which color best represents your chapter. But try to go quickly and don't overthink it. Your gut instinct can help you get a more authentic snapshot of your ministry.

Am I supposed to score all greens?

No. In fact, you might only need to become green in a few rows for your context. Discern these areas of growth with your supervisor.

I feel judged or ashamed from this exercise. What should I do?

Any evaluation tool can make you feel judged or overwhelmed. Take a moment to pray and offer these feelings to Jesus. This scorecard is designed to help you recognize your current reality and create a wise growth plan for the next one to three years. Please take risks, give yourself a lot of grace, and learn from what you try this year.

I'm not good at planning and executing events. How should I try and grow in this?

We suggest setting two goals per event:

- Qualitative (what vibe do you hope for)
- Quantitative (how many people will be impacted)

Afterwards, learn from the event. Did you impact people the way you hoped? What helped and/or hindered reaching your qualitative and quantitative goals? What's one thing you could do differently next year?
