

Developing Ministry Leaders: Assessing Reality

Fill in each student or volunteer you are hoping will join your apprentice (or pre-leadership) training program. Place a "Y" for a skill area if you've seen them use the skill, otherwise mark "N."

1. **Network Mapping** – Explain what a network map is. Teach the student how to make a network map, how to make the most of their network, and to pray regularly for friends that don't know Jesus yet.
2. **Compelling Invites** – Students understand the qualities of what makes up a compelling invitation and have worked on both creating compelling invitations and making those invitations.
3. **How to Share the Gospel** – Students understand the need to share the Gospel and how to use a Gospel tool to actually share the Gospel.
4. **Knowing Where Someone is Spiritually** - Students understand how to assess where a person is in their spiritual journey, and to engage them to spur them on to their next step. The goal would be for the student to learn how to build trust with Non-Christians and learn the skills needed to facilitate and shepherd a group of their peers. (This could be gathering some friends that don't know Jesus yet for coffee, starting a GIG or Small Group).
